



**IMPORTANT NOTICE -- Pembroke Pines Currently Meeting Safe Drinking Water Act Standards. TRIHALOMETHANE (TTHM) Violation Ends**

*The City of Pembroke Pines would like to inform all of our residents that the violation for exceedance of the Maximum Contaminant Level for Trihalomethane that started on the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter of 2016 ended on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2017. The Locational Running Annual Average (LRAA) has returned to a value below the regulatory limit of 80 parts per billion (ppb).*

***Pembroke Pines Water is meeting Federal and State regulatory standards and currently there are no known risks associated with the use of the City's water for any purpose. The Florida Department of Health has informed the City that the residents can be notified that the previous disinfection byproduct notices are no longer in effect.***
